In joining the wider WHPC community, we have committed to supporting and promoting the role of women across the world of high-performance computing. Through the application process N8 CIR identified three key areas to focus on:

- Addressing the issue of gender balance within N8 CIR
- Improving the gender balance at workshops by identifying barriers that women face when applying for places
- Identifying and challenging reasons why there are so few women in senior roles in the HPC community and raising the profile of people from under-represented groups through case studies, interviews and online promotion


