What would normally have been a two-week installation and commissioning process has been extended to more than two months because of restrictions imposed as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic.

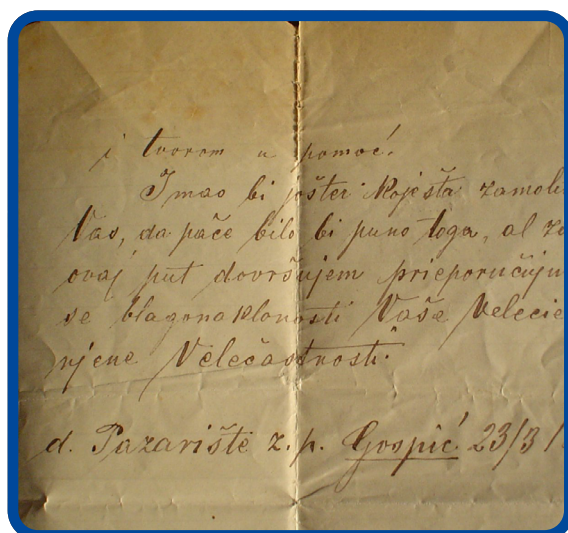

## Digital Humanities Reports

On 29 September the Software Sustainability Institute published *Sustaining the Digital Humanities in the UK*. The report identifies recommendations for the SSI to help them to advance their mission to create better and more sustainable research software in the humanities.

Also published was The Turing Institute's white paper on *The Challenges and prospects of the intersection of Humanities and Data Science*. This paper also reflects the growing importance of digital methods to the study of arts and humanities across the UK.
